- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To announce the winner of the 2006 Donald A. Buchannon Scholarship.
- 2. <u>Background</u>. The Donald A. Buchannon Scholarship Fund was established to commemorate the memory of Don Buchannon, who died in 1989 after 25 years of dedicated service to the Job Corps program and its students. This is the final release of the Donald A. Buchannon Scholarship Fund Award. The funds have been awarded to the seven students below, each of whom will receive \$2,500. The remaining balance will be donated to the Angell, PIVOT, Springdale, Talking Leaves, Timber Lake and Tongue Point Job Corps Centers.

In 1964, Don began his career in Job Corps as a counselor at the Grants Pass Job Corps Center in Grants Pass, Oregon. His subsequent experiences included serving as Project Manager; Deputy Regional Director, and Regional Director in both the Seattle and San Francisco regions; a 2-year assignment at the National Office of Job Corps; and numerous other details and special assignments as needed by the National Director of Job Corps. Don was a valued member of the Job Corps family. As a tribute to Don's firm belief in the value of education, a scholarship fund was established to remember his many contributions to the Job Corps program.

The scholarship is intended to offer financial support to Job Corps students who desire to continue their education. Scholarship payments will be made directly to the educational institutions.

3. Scholarship Winners.

Ms. Rebecca Lee Stupak, Pittsburgh Job Corps Center, is currently enrolled at the Community College of Allegheny County. She has been accepted at the University of Pittsburgh.
