SUBJECT:	Global Youth Service Day and Earth Day 2013

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To provide information, resources, and partnership opportunities for Global Youth Service Day (GYSD) and Earth Day 2013.
- 2. <u>Background</u>. Each year, Job Corps students participate in activities during the month of April to engage students in Global Youth Service Day and to commemorate Earth Day. This year, Earth Day is April 22 and Global Youth Service Day (GYSD) is April 26-28. Students and staff members are encouraged to participate on and around these dates. Both events mobilize millions of youth around the world to improve their communities through service and service-learning, and give students and staff opportunities to participate in activities that support a more sustainable world.

Job Corps centers are encouraged to focus their 2013 GYSD and Earth Day activities on reducing pollution and addressing climate change. The president's goals for the environment include reducing greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change.

There are many ways to participate – from projects, education, and campaigns on center, to working with local organizations. Whether building a community garden, helping neighbors save energy, or supporting disaster prevention and relief, Job Corps students can find their voices by taking action and creating real change through GYSD and Earth Day activities. Centers can contact their area's GYSD lead-agency point of contact (Attachment A) to explore additional partnership opportunities. Also, excellent resources (see Attachment B) are available online; students and staff members may use these to develop ideas.

Established in 1988, GYSD is the largest service event in the world, and the only day of service dedicated to children and youth. GYSD is celebrated each year in more than 100 countries and is organized through Youth Service America.

Earth Day brings together more than a billion people in Earth Day-related activities each year, making it the largest civic observance in the world. The global theme for Earth Day 2013, "The Face of Climate Change," highlights the mounting impact of climate change on individuals around the world.
