<p>The King Center http://www.thekingcenter.org/</p>	<p><i>The Center for Nonviolent Social Change</i> is part of the King Library and Archives, and is the largest digital repository of primary source materials on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the American Civil Rights Movement in the world. This site provides access to historical information, letters, and information on the King Scholars curriculum, which informs teachers how to weave lessons of freedom, justice and peace into daily lessons.</p>

The CRC has three programmatic units: Office of Internal Enforcement, Office of External Enforcement, and Office of Compliance and Policy. There are webinars, slides, reports and info graphics designed to engage and inform. CEW launched this initiative to coincide with the 25th anniversary of the White House Initiative on Educational Excellence for Hispanics, which includes additional tools in English and Spanish, also established under CEW’s equity umbrella of technical support.</p>
