Photo Guidelines:

- Nominee should be wearing her training uniform, including safety gear like goggles if necessary. Note: If her training uniform includes a mask or helmet, please make sure it is not pulled down over face. It can be pulled back on her head.
- Please have the nominee remove any facial jewelry, including nose rings, lip rings, and earrings.
- Make sure the nominee does not have any visible tattoos in the picture.
- The photo should be taken of the student from the waist up.
- The staffer should take the photo of the student against a plain backdrop, like a classroom or dorm wall.
- The photo should be portrait-oriented, high-resolution, and at least 600 pixels wide.
